Read accurately by blending the sounds in words that contain the graphemes taught so far, especially recognising alternative sounds for graphemes

Read aloud books closely matched to their improving phonic knowledge, sounding out unfamiliar words accurately,

automatically and without undue hesitation

Check that the text makes sense to them as they read and correct inaccurate reading

Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far and their own experience

Write for different purposes, using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation to demarcate sentences
