We will also look at wind and do some science experiments to see how things can be moved with wind power. In phonics, we will be reviewing and assessing the sounds taught so far. Thank you so much for supporting the children's' phonics practise at home. In maths this week, the children will consolidate their understanding of the composition of 5. The children will deepen their 8/1 understanding of a 'whole' being made up of smaller parts through practical experience. They will begin to recognise that numbers can be made by combining parts in different ways, and will be encouraged to make links by considering similarities and differences in the ways of making 5.
