Maths

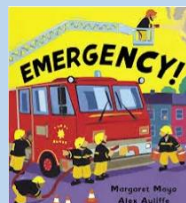
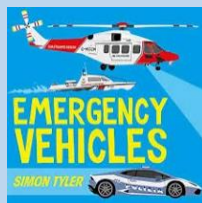
In maths this week we will begin to explore composition of numbers by focusing on the concept of 'wholes' and 'parts'. By investigating familiar toys they will begin to understand that whole things are often made up of smaller parts and that a whole is, therefore, bigger than its parts. Then when looking at numbers, for example 3, they will learn 2 and 1 are part of 3.

Phonics

In phonics this week we will be learning the sounds for sh, th, ng, nk. Please continue to read every day and practise the sounds they have learnt so far. By this stage the children should be gaining confidence at reading the phonemes s a t p i n g o c k ck e u d r j v w x y z. Literacy

In our literacy lessons this week we will be focusing on non-fiction books and comparing them to fiction books, highlighting the differences. We will be discussing page layout, titles, labels, captions and diagrams.
