The Continents of the World

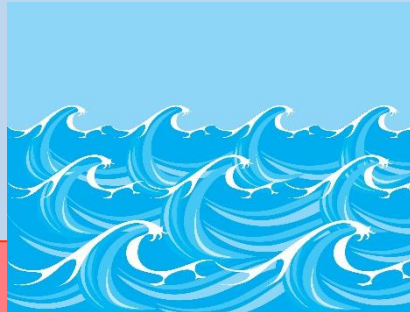
There are 7 continents on Earth. From smallest to largest these are:

Topic Overview

We will be looking at the world's 7 continents and its oceans, looking at the hot and cold areas of the world.

Key Vocabulary

Continent- A continent is a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents.

Ocean- A far larger body of open water than a sea.

Sea- A smaller part of an ocean and is typically partially contained by an area of land.

Channel- A wide strait or waterway between two landmasses that lie close to each other

Equator- Hottest part of the earth

The Equator

This is the hottest part of the earth and this is due to the earth's orbit around the sun.

It is an 'imaginary line' halfway between the North and South Pole.

UK Surrounding Seas

The oceans that surround the UK are: **North Sea Atlantic Ocean, English Channel, Irish Sea and Celtic Sea.**

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
